## William Beaumont Army Medical Center



WBAMC transitioned to the Defense Health Agency in September of 2021, establishing the El Paso Market, which provides healthcare to over 115,000 qualified TRICARE beneficiaries, fostering a tradition of military medicine in the southwest region for over 100 years and counting. The staff is comprised of both military and civilian medical professionals with an average staff population of 3200.

WBAMC was formerly located northwest of Fort Bliss between Fred Wilson Road and Hayes Avenue. The hospital made the move to the new facility located on the east side of Fort Bliss, adjacent to the Spur 601 and Loop 375 connection, on July 11, 2021.
